Furyk designates funds from the Presidents Cup to the MaliVai Washington Kids Foundation

(January 4, 2010) Jim Furyk, a 13-time PGA TOUR event winner, has recently designated a check in the amount of 30,000 to the MaliVai Washington Kids Foundation. The contribution is a portion of the charitable proceeds generated from The Presidents Cup 2009 at Harding Park Golf Course in San Francisco, California, in which Furyk participated as a member of the victorious U.S. Team for the sixth time in his career.

The presidents Cup is a unique golf event in that there is no purse or prize money. Players are not personally paid for their participation, but each competitor, captain, and captain's assistant is allowed to allocate funds to chosen charitable causes. Furyk is a long time supporter of the MaliVai Washington Kids Foundation. MWKF is a local non-profit organization that was founded by former Wimbledon finalist MaliVai Washington. MWKF's flagship program, TnT (Tennis-n-Tutoring) provides FREE afterschool homework assistance, mentoring, tutoring, life skills classes and tennis lessons to over 150 underserved youth. More than \$4.2 million was distributed to charitable causes from the Presidents Cup 2009, a record-setting amount for the prestigious competition and part of the nearly \$22 million raised since the inception of event in 1994.

The Presidents Cup, a team match play competition featuring 24 of the world's top golfers – 12 from the United States and 12 from around the world, excluding Europe – is held every two years, and since 1996 has alternated between United States and international venues. This year, the U.S. Team retained the Cup from the Internationals in one of the most exciting and successful events to date.

About Jim Furyk in 2009: Furyk trailed by 3 strokes entering the final round of the Masters Tournament and finishes tied for 10th, his fourth career top-10 at Augusta National Golf Club. He tied for fifth at THE PLAYERS Championship, his third top-5 finish in his last six starts at the tournament. He closed with 11 consecutive pars in a final-round 65 at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial to tie for ninth, his fifth top-10 of the season. He finishes second at the Memorial, one stroke behind Tiger Woods. He earned his third consecutive top-10 finish at AT&T National with a tie for seventh.
